Q: Why?

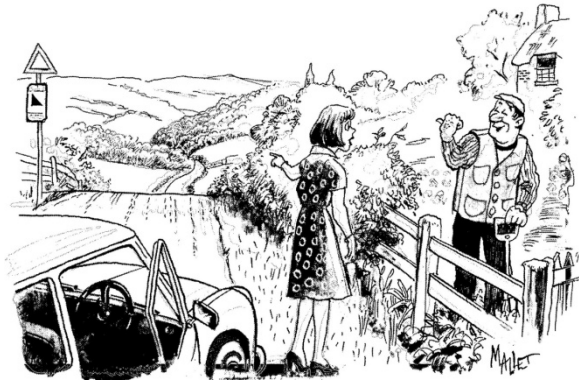
A: Because she does not have much time.
