Kid 1: You can't say that. Your scores are nearly the same as mine!

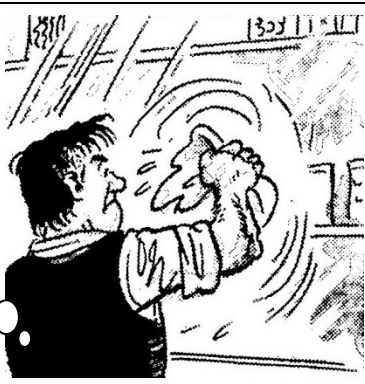
Kid 3: That's right. What does that long word say?

hands



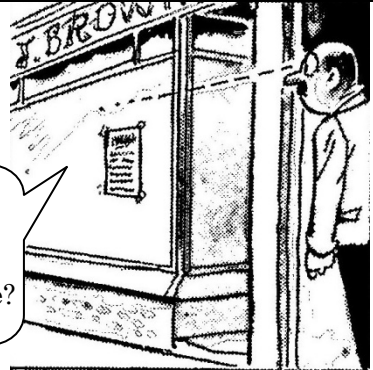
Mr. Brown was angry and

glass.



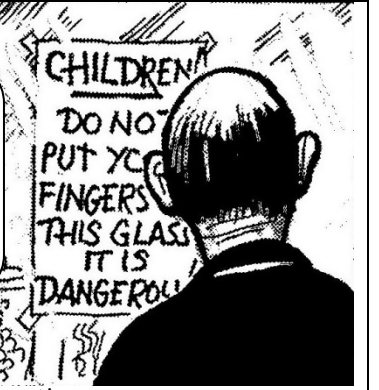
Then he put a notice in his window.
